about a business trip to Saint Petersburg (Russian Federation) from April 15 to April 20, 2025

In connection with the research conducted under project AR 19675171 titled: "Criminal law and criminological measures to ensure safety in mining or construction works" implemented within the framework of grant funding by the Science Committee of the Ministry of Science and Higher Education of the Republic of Kazakhstan for 2023–2025, a business trip to Saint Petersburg, Russian Federation, was undertaken from April 15 to April 20, 2025, by senior researcher of the Research Institute of Economic and Legal Studies of Karaganda University of Kazpotrebsoyuz Sadvakasova Adel Talgatovna and master of law Mazhit Inkar Bergenkyzy.



In accordance with the implementation plan of the grant project funded by the Ministry of Science and Higher Education of the Republic of Kazakhstan, a working visit was conducted by the research group to Saint Petersburg State University and Saint Petersburg State University of Economics (Russian Federation).

During the visit, meetings were held with the administration and academic staff (including N.G. Stoyko, N.P. Kirillova, S.M. Olennikov, V.V. Veklenko, N.I. Pryakhina, E.V. Suslina, D.V. Sinkov, E.K. Kutuev, O.A. Shapiro, V.L. Miroshnichenko, V.Yu. Nizamov, among others) of the law faculties, including deans and leading professors. These meetings focused on discussing the objectives and tasks of future cooperation as well as the subject of the ongoing research.





Following the approved business trip plan, the members of the research group held lectures for students, and also, together with faculty members, organized a scientific seminar on the subject of the research.



The visit also included an introductory visit to university libraries, where the research team studied in detail a number of specialized legal and scientific databases, as well as exchanged specialized scientific literature.

Special attention was paid to sections devoted to international law, including master's and doctoral theses, as well as issues of international scientific journals.





The trip to St. Petersburg State University and St. Petersburg State University of Economics became a significant stage in strengthening international scientific cooperation and expanding academic exchange in the field of criminal law, criminal procedure and criminology. The discussion of safety issues during mining and construction work with leading experts allowed us to share best practices and consider the possibility of applying international approaches in Kazakh practice. Such initiatives make a significant contribution to the development of scientific potential, contribute to the formation of high standards of legal regulation and strengthen partnerships with foreign educational and scientific institutions.
